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Scavenger Hunt

Divide the class into groups of two or three. Distribute a scavenger hunt list to each group. Each group will complete a math problem and use classroom and library resources to complete the hunt successfully. When all groups have finished, answers may be shared with the class and written on index cards to be shuffled and reused, along with other questions about the Civil War to play North vs. South. Divide the class into two groups, Union and Confederacy. One member from each team stands as the teacher reads a question. The first player to correctly answer the question earns a point for his or her team. If neither player can answer the question, it is returned to the pile.
