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# Story Scenes from Strega Nona

**Directions:**

Give each child a large sheet of white construction paper or butcher paper.


Have children draw Strega Nona's house and the pasta pot, as shown in the illustration to the right. You may wish to draw these on the chalkboard and have the children copy them on their papers.

Reproduce the figures of Big Anthony and Strega Nona on page 21. Color, cut out, and glue the figures to their pictures.

Reproduce and hand out a copy of the "Sentence Blocks" on page 24 to each student. Help students use the listed words at the top in sentences that relate the block title to the story. If age appropriate, reinforce the use of capitals, periods, quotations, commas in a series, contractions, possessives, etc.

Have the children cut out and glue the sentence blocks to their pictures. It is not necessary to place the sentence blocks in a specific order.

A set of sentence blocks might look like this:
