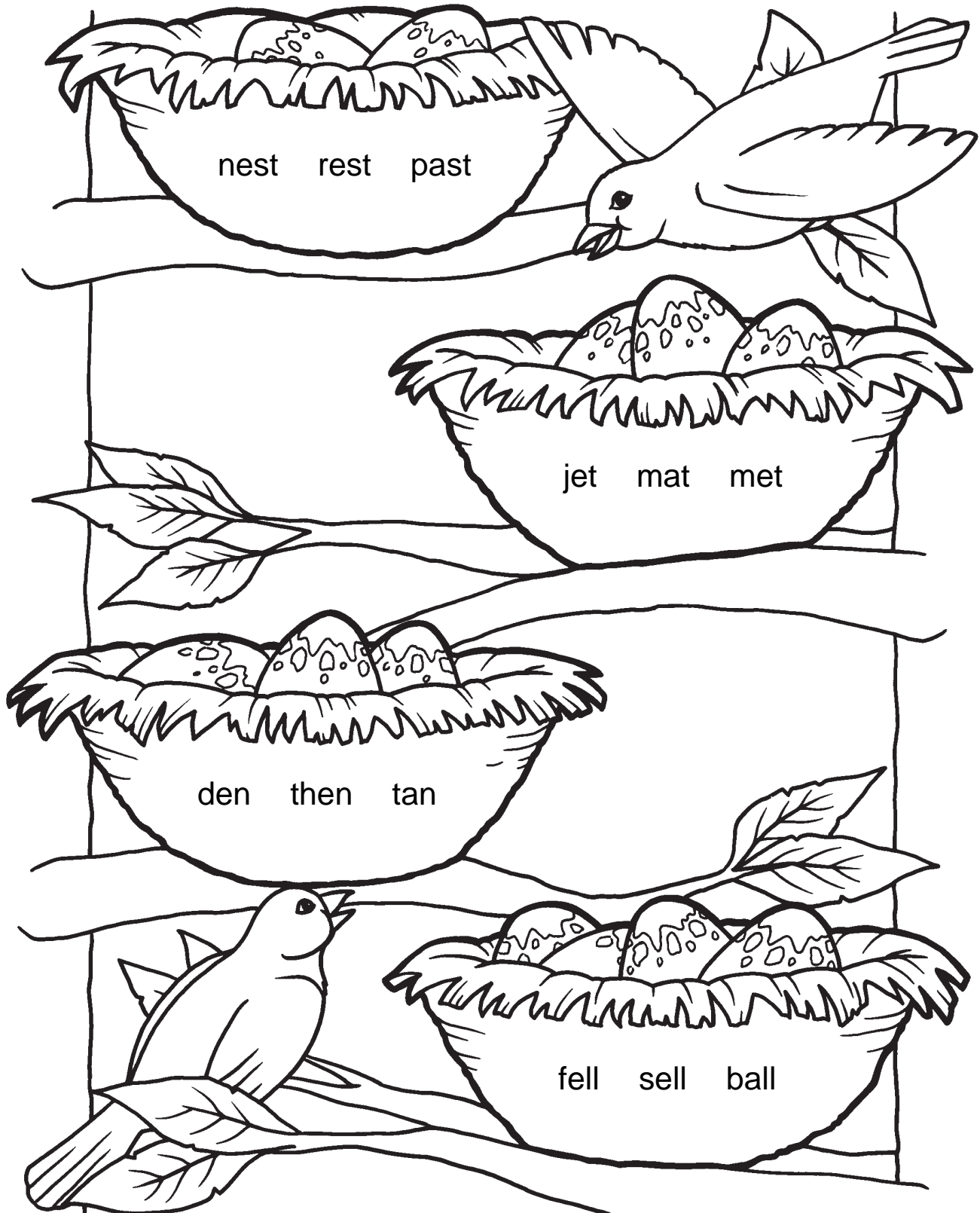

Circle the pair of rhyming short *e* words on each nest. Color the picture.

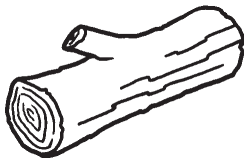
