## **April Answer Key (cont.)**

### **April 24**

The first American League baseball game was played between Cleveland and Chicago on April 24, 1901. Chicago won by a score of 8 to 2. In what two states are these cities? (Answer: *Cleveland is in Ohio; Chicago is in Illinois.*)

---

### **April 25**

On April 25, 1901, New York became the first state to require automobile license plates. It cost \$1.00 to buy the plates. Why do states require drivers to put license plates on their cars? (Answer: *License plates allow cars to be easily identified by law enforcement officials.*)

---

### **April 26**

Charles Richter was born on April 26, 1900. He was a seismologist who developed the Richter Scale. This scale measures the force of earthquakes. A quake of less than 3.0 is hardly noticeable, but a quake of 6.0 can cause buildings to shake.

---

### **April 27**

Ulysses S. Grant was born on April 27, 1822. He was the eighteenth president of the United States. He was also the commander of the Union Army during the Civil War. The Transcontinental Railroad was finished during his presidency.

---

### **April 28**

James Monroe was born on April 28, 1758. He was the fifth U.S. president and the only other president besides George Washington to run unopposed. What does “unopposed” mean? (Answer: *“Unopposed” means that no one ran against the candidate. In this case it was Monroe.*)

---

### **April 29**

On April 29, 1913, Gideon Sundback patented the zipper. He called it a “separable fastener,” because you could separate the two parts from each other and then fasten them back together again.

---

### **April 30**

On April 30, 1803, Napoleon sold the Louisiana Territory to President Thomas Jefferson for about two cents per acre. It was the largest land purchase in world history. What states were included in the Louisiana Territory? (Answer: *All of Louisiana, Arkansas, Missouri, Nebraska, South Dakota, North Dakota, and Iowa were in the territory. Parts of Montana, Colorado, Wyoming, Oklahoma, Mississippi, Alabama, Kansas, and Minnesota were also in the territory.*)
