



## Rules to Know (cont.)



- 5. When writing the title of a book, underline the entire title and capitalize the first word, the last word, and each important word.
  - Have you read the book <u>Hansel and Gretel</u>?
  - <u>Little Red Riding Hood</u> is my favorite book.
- 6. A present tense verb shows action that happens now. A past tense verb tells about an action that already happened. Add -ed to most verbs to form past tense. If the verb has a single vowel and ends with a consonant, double the last consonant before adding -ed. If it ends with e, drop the final e and add -ed.
  - > (paint) Yesterday he painted the house.
  - ➤ (hop) The rabbit hopped away.
  - > (like) They liked their new school.
- 7. The verbs am, are, is, was, and were are not action words. Instead, they tell what someone or something is like.

Use am with the word I.

Use *is* and *are* when talking about what is happening now.

Use was and were when talking about things that have already happened.

Use is and was when talking about one person, place, thing, or animal.

Use are and were when talking about more than one person, place, thing, or animal and with the word *you*.

- > I am six years old.
- ➤ Jim <u>is</u> seven years old.
  ➤ Last year Jim <u>was</u> six.
- Kate and Nate are eight.
- > You are six years old.
- > They were seven last year.
- 8. Do not use the word ain't or spell verbs incorrectly as they are often mispronounced.
  - ➤ We ain't going.
  - ➤ We wanna leave.
  - Are you gonna go?
  - > Dontcha like her?

- → We are not going.
- → We want to leave.
- → Are you going to go?
- → Don't you like her?
