

Please read and follow the guidelines below very carefully. Your performance should:

- Be at least five minutes in length
- Have full knowledge of the plot, setting, and characters for the chosen scene
- Effectively recreate the scene using audio/visual props (artwork, music, costumes, props, etc.)
- Use information from the novel to accurately portray a character
- Use words and mannerisms to emulate both the personality and dialect of the character
- Remain "in character" for the duration of the scene
- Explain why the chosen scene is important
