Introduction

Write On – Wipe Off books are engaging, versatile learning tools that can be enjoyed over and over again. The pages are highly durable and allow for easy erasing. These books work with all dry-erase markers and resist ghosting—the remnants of faint print marks. Fill each page and then just wipe away and start again! To ensure your child can use these pages many different times, make sure they erase their writing fairly quickly after the ink dries. Do not leave writing on the page for an indefinite amount of time, otherwise it may be hard to erase.

We often underestimate the use of mazes in teaching and reinforcing skills in children. Mazes are not just fun activities; there are educational benefits for developing young minds in negotiating and mastering a maze.

On these pages, children will practice hand-eye coordination, fine-motor skills, spatial sense, deductive-reasoning skills, planning, problem-solving skills, and logical-thinking skills. Don't worry if some of the mazes stump your child at first. Encourage them to work through the puzzles, developing their own planning and estimating skills.

Mazes can be tricky for beginners, so it's important to demonstrate how they are done. Do one or two together with your child before expecting them to be independent. You might even have them cross out all incorrect paths before finding their way through the maze. The best part is that if they make a mistake, they can just wipe it away and try again!
