Word Endings: "ia," "ian," & "ious"

- Words ending in "ia" are pronounced "E-uh."
- Words ending in "ian" are pronounced "E-un."
- When a word ends in "ious," it is usually pronounced "E-us."

cafeteria	caf•e•te•ri•a	We took our lunch bags to the cafeteria.
encyclopedia	en•cy•clo•pe•di•a	Let's look up walruses in the encyclopedia .
librarian	li•brar•i•an	The librarian helped me find reference materials.
vegetarian	veg•e•tar•i•an	He's a vegetarian and won't eat any meat.
historian	his•to•ri•an	The town historian has records that are 150 years old.
various	var•i•ous	The bag was filled with various kinds of sweets.
curious	cu•ri•ous	The curious dog nudged the door open and slipped inside.
serious	se•ri•ous	The police are rushing to a serious accident.
