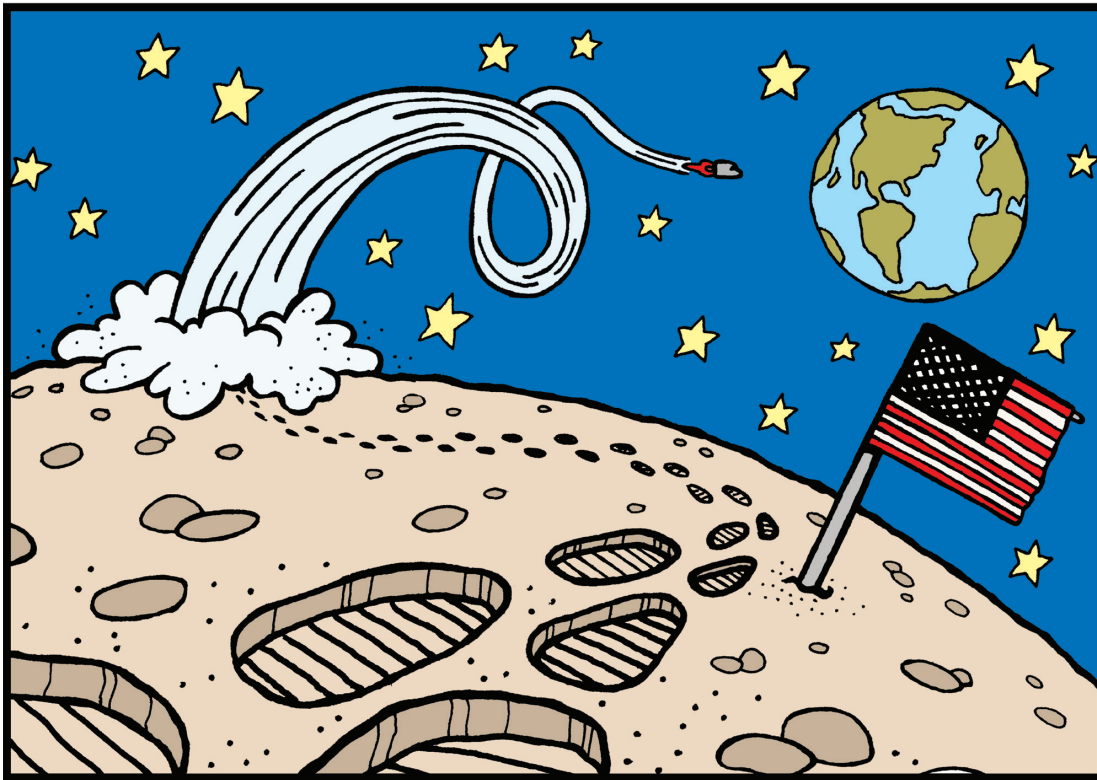


Left on the Moon

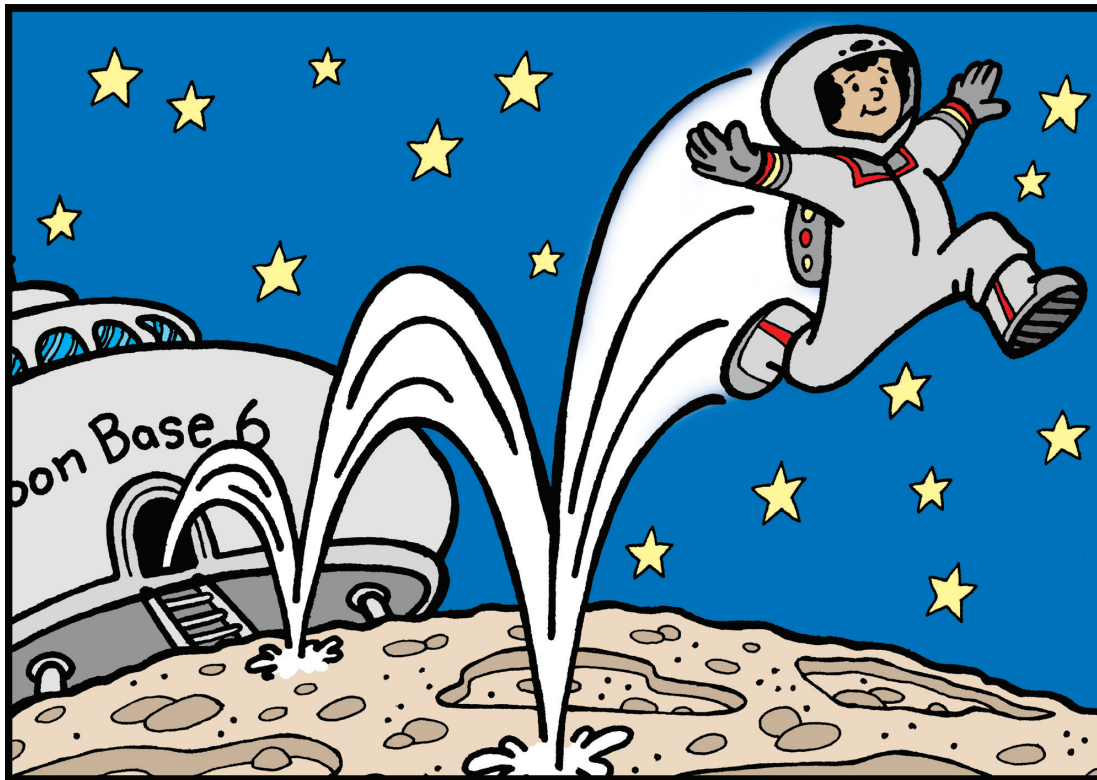


Neil Armstrong stepped out of the *Eagle*. It was July 20, 1969. Neil went where no person had ever gone before. He stepped on the moon.
