Welcome to the *Summer Connect* series. This exciting, full-color book is geared to help young learners transitioning from first grade to second grade. It provides a review of Math, Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies topics from the previous academic year and progresses to new material that will be covered in second grade.

With your help, students will practice reading and following directions while fine-tuning a variety of fine-motor skills including circling, crossing out, drawing lines and filling in blanks as they complete each colorful page.
